Applications and Nominations

Nomination

All students must be nominated by their home university before applying. Nominations must be submitted online through the official nomination portal and be received at least two weeks before the application deadline.

Nomination deadlines:

Autumn semester

- Non-EU/EEA citizens: 15 March
- EU/EEA citizens: 15 April

Spring semester

- Non-EU/EEA citizens: 15 August
- EU/EEA citizens: 15 September

Application

Nominated students will receive detailed application instructions.

Applications are submitted through the University of Iceland's online application system.

Application deadlines:

Autumn semester

- Non-EU/EEA citizens: 1 April
- EU/EEA citizens: 1 May

Spring semester

- Non-EU/EEA citizens: 1 September
- EU/EEA citizens: 1 October

Application Check List

- ✓ Completed online application form including preliminary course selection (30 ECTS per semester, 60% in major)
- ✓ Copy of passport or valid ID
- ✓ Official transcript of records in English or a Nordic language (digitally signed or stamped)

Credits and Gradings

30 ECTS = full-time per semester.

60% of courses must be within the student's major.

Transcripts of Records

Digitally signed transcripts are accessible at the end of the study period for forwarding to home universities.

Course selection must total 30 ECTS credits per semester, where at least 60% of courses are within the students' major.

Course Restrictions

- > Law and Economics – no undergraduates
- > Medicine, Nursing, Psychology and Pharmaceutical Sciences – by prior agreement only
- > MBA – closed
- > Earth Science – at least 1 year of geology/geophysics

- > English – only for English majors (except 'English for Practical Purposes')
- > Icelandic-taught courses – mostly closed to exchange students

Language Requirements

Language of Instruction

The primary language of instruction at the University is Icelandic. Many courses are available in English that are open for exchange students.

Courses in Icelandic as a second language are available.

English Language Requirements

Students from non-EU/EEA countries whose native language is not English must provide proof of English proficiency. Accepted tests include:

- ✓ TOEFL (minimum score: 79)
- ✓ IELTS Academic (minimum score: 6.5)
- ✓ PTE Academic
- ✓ Cambridge English (CAE or CPE)

This requirement ensures that students can participate fully in courses and student life, as no special language support is provided. A self-assessment of English proficiency is also included in the application.

Registration and Student Permit

Registration Requirements

- EU/EEA: Register with Registers Iceland
- Bring EHIC and/or form E-104

- Non-EU/EEA: Must apply for residence permit with the Directorate of Immigration before arrival

Health Care

» Health Insurance is required for all non-EU/EEA students. Six-month coverage starts around ISK 15,000.
