Courses in the English Language Programme are only available to exchange students majoring in English at their home university or students who are very proficient in English (except the course "English for Practical Purposes"). Courses taught in Icelandic are generally not open to exchange students. 	

Exchange students get a digitally signed transcript of academic records at the end of their stay. The transcript is sent directly to their University of Iceland e-mail address and their home university nominator approx. 6 weeks after final exams.
